POLLUTION

Pollution is the presence or introduction of a harmful or poisonous substance or thing in the environment.



Harmful chemicals, such as soaps and battery acid, negatively harm local aquatic plants and animals found in our lakes and streams.



Never put fats, oils, and greases (F.O.G.) down any storm drain, sink or toilet. Over time, F.O.G. can build up and clog your pipes if not properly disposed.



Animal waste allows the growth of a harmful bacteria, E. Coli. If too much E. Coli is in the lakes, swimming becomes off limits!

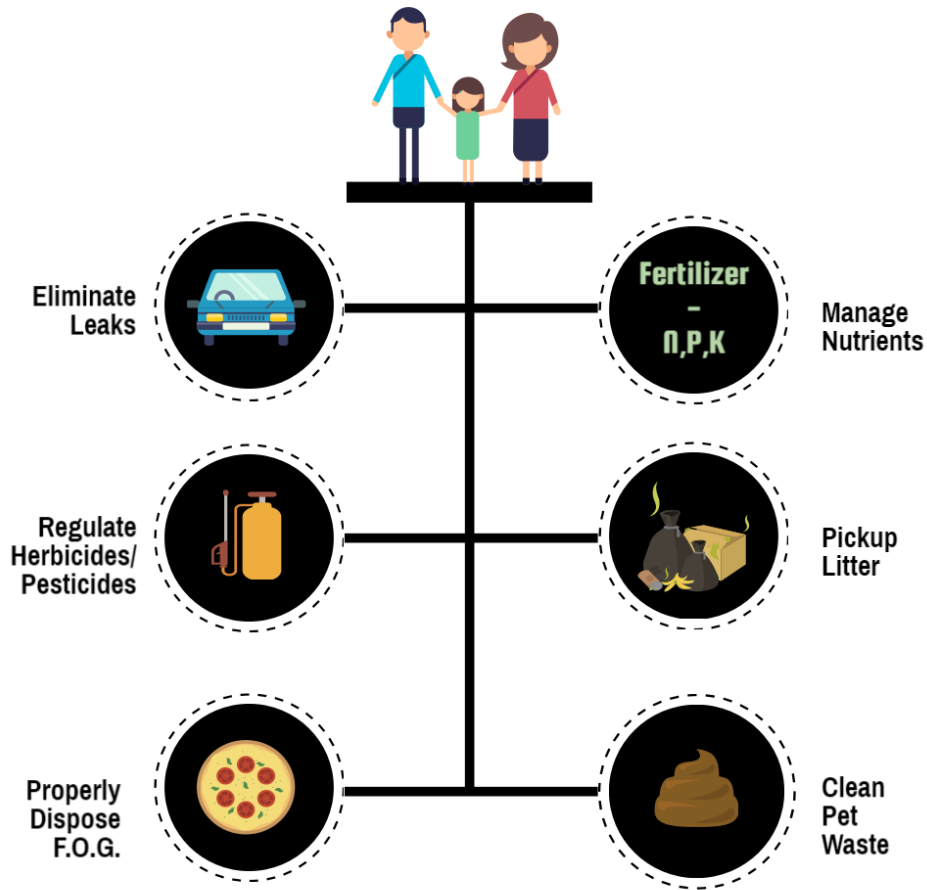
